# Pastoral Pondering . . . .

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven."

Ecclesiastes 3:1

The month of May is a month of transition, a change from one season to another. The grass that begins to turn green in April, begins to grow. The lawn mowers that had been put in storage, are given an oil change, blades are sharpened, new gas fills the tank and preparation for the new season of cutting grass that is now growing. The trees begin to bud with new leaves in April. But by the end of May, we can once again hear the wind rustle through the new green leaves. The fields are awakened from their long winter slumber. Tractors and planters, like the lawn mowers, have been tuned and prepared to begin a new season. The fields are fertilized. The earth is prepared for the seeds and the seeds are planted. In the beginning of the month, we drive a little slower by some fields looking and waiting for the crops to sprout. By the end of May, one can easily row the corn and the soybeans.

Most of the time, when April transitions into May, winter has finally let go of its grasp upon the land and the warm spring days have arrived. Flower beds that were sleeping, suddenly have hands of gardeners digging in them once again. Suddenly, there is color in the yards, colors different than the white snow blanket. Added to the green of the grass and the green of new leaves are bright yellow, red and blue flowers.

There are several life transitions that also occur in the month of May. On May 12<sup>th</sup>, we will honor all the ladies in the congregation, who have shared their love and faith with all of us. On Friday and Saturday, May 17 & 18, the Southeast Iowa Synod will meet in Coralville, IA. On May 19, two of our young adults will graduate from Chariton High School – Madison Buckalew and Carson Oxenreider; they will finish up a journey and walk across the stage to receive a diploma, and from that moment will look forward to continuing their education at college. And finally, on May 27<sup>th</sup> we'll pause to remember those who have shared their lives with us, as we honor them on Memorial Day.

May is a month of continuing transitions. May brings transitions and changes in our spiritual journey as well. March and April led us on a journey of Lent, when we focus upon our Lord's suffering, leading up to the cross. During Holy Week, Jesus sets an example for us to be servants as Jesus washes the feet of his disciples and gives us a new commandment to love one another, on Good Friday we contemplated our Lord taking on the powers of sin and death as he dies on a cross, and then on Easter we joined Mary and Peter by shouting to the world "He is risen! He is risen indeed!" The tomb is empty. Jesus lives to die no more. The power of God's love continues to create new change in the world. Jesus reconciles with the disciples and gives them his peace. Jesus gives them the power and authority in his name to forgive sins. The Holy Spirit recreates us from sinner to saint. From brokenness to being restored. From standing in sin, to being forgiven. From loving with our love that can be weak and lost to being claimed by God's unconditional love. Of course, God's love and grace that creates newness of life is never restricted to just one given moment but is always making life new. Enjoy the transitions of May and the new life that Christ gives you!
